About Our Program: The doctoral program at Virginia Tech prepares students for successful careers at top business schools in the U.S. and around the world. We heavily emphasize research skills, which students develop over 4 to 5 years through coursework, research-focused program requirements, regular faculty interactions, and co-authored projects. Our faculty are experts in a variety of research methods (archival, experimental, and qualitative) and topics (audit, financial, managerial, governance, and tax), giving each student a personalized experience that caters to their unique area of interest.

RESEARCH: The objective of our program is to graduate high-quality researchers who will publish in top accounting journals. Each student develops at least three research papers as part of the minimum program requirements, and most pursue additional research projects co-authored with Virginia Tech faculty. Our students also regularly participate in major research conferences throughout the year.



FUNDING: In addition to a full tuition waiver and comprehensive fee scholarship, each student receives an annual stipend/scholarship of approximately \$46,000 for the first two years and \$40,000 for the following years (with the chance to earn competitive summer grants and other scholarships). Additional funding is available for coding camp, conference attendance, and research support (e.g., computer, software, data).
