

## ACIS 4684 & 5584 Online Case Discussions

### **Purpose:**

Cases offer a unique opportunity to practice decision making related to information security in complex situations. They also offer many opportunities to consider different alternatives and debate the pros and cons of various decisions. In this assignment, you will have an online discussion with other students.

Groups of 6-7 persons are randomly assigned by the system for each case.

### **Deliverables:**

#### **1. Initial Posting. Due 02:30 PM on case due date.**

You must load your answers to all of the questions to the case discussion forum by 02:30 PM on the case due date.

1. This replaces the case summaries. **No case summaries please.**
2. Initial posting will be worth 4 points.
  - You will not be able to see other people's posts in your group until after you have posted your answers. (If you are the first person, please check the forum again later).
  - Answers should be thoughtful but relatively short. Answers that bring outside material should clearly indicate the source of the material.

#### **2. Group Discussion. Due 11:59 PM on Friday of the week the case is discussed.**

After you have posted your answers, you will see the answers from the other students in your assigned group (who have posted to that point). You must then continue the discussion on at least 3 of the elements discussed by others in your group.

- Once you have access to them, you should read your groupmates' posts.
- At that point, you can reply to them or start a new thread within your group to enhance the discussion of those 3 points.
- You can for example explain why you agree or disagree with what someone has said or you can provide more insights into that particular question.
- The key point is that discussions should be insightful and help everyone learn more from the case.
- Good discussions will stimulate further thoughts and discussions.
- Statements like "I agree" are not considered a discussion and will be marked down. Please see the discussion rubric for details.
- Discussions that bring outside material should clearly indicate the source of the material.
- Everyone should participate in at least 3 discussion points.
- This discussion is worth up to 4 points. Since you have 3 cases left, you can make 12 points (on 10) for case discussions. This grade is labeled case discussion participation on Canvas.

**Note:** Answers should be offered in complete sentences and well-formed thoughts. A list of bullet points is not a sufficient answer.

**Note:** You can provide your initial posting at any time before the due dates.
